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

Puget Sound—No, we haven't started testing amphibious vehicles. Yet. What we have really been up to is taking the improved 2001 Mazda Millenia S on a real-world test drive around this area, including island-hopping on the ferries and exploring the art galleries.

Millenia perfectly balances luxury and performance.

For the trip, we drove north to Seattle to take in some of the many sights there, including side trips to the San Juan Islands. We also spent some time finding interesting roads that were relatively free of urban traffic. Along the way, whenever we had the chance, we combined business pleasure with personal, taking the opportunity to scout local galleries for northwest Native American-inspired art.

The Millenia is a far cry from most of the sedans in its class. Its styling, always classy, is now even more distinctive for 2001. Inside, it's a model of tasteful comfort and convenience. Under the hood, the Millenia S continues with the 210-hp Miller-cycle V6 engine, the only automotive engine of its type. (You can read more about this on the next pages.) The transmission is an electronically controlled 4-speed automatic with overdrive and a "hold" mode that lets the driver keep it in a lower gear for added control. The S model rides on 17-inch alloy wheels with all-season performance radials.


On the freeway heading up to Seattle, the Millenia proved a comfortable, quiet and fast cruiser. We had to keep close watch on the speedometer, as the car's power and smoothness made highway driving so relaxed as to seem almost effortless. We found the cruise control to be a very valuable feature here. We were even more impressed on twisting

two-lanes, where the tight and precise handling made itself known. There was plenty of passing power too; indeed, the acceleration rush is one of the joys of driving the Millenia S.

Throughout, we had spectacular weather. ("The mountains are out," people exclaimed.) On the one day we did encounter a little drizzle, the Millenia imparted a total sense of security on the wet roads. We knew it had a Traction Control System (TCS), so naturally we had to test that when we found slippery conditions. And after pushing the performance envelope just hard enough, we can report that the TCS is very effective. No matter the surface, the Millenia communicated well—we always could easily "read" the road through the steering and suspension. And of course, anti-lock brakes are standard equipment.

All in all, we discovered the Millenia S to be a superbly balanced car, quick and responsive, fast and smooth. It gave us all the luxury we could want, but never in a way that compromised the performance. It was also a perfect car for inspiring an artwork search.


One of the features we have always liked in the Millenia is the Miller-cycle V6 engine, and we're happy to report that it continues in all its glory in this new model.




A Miller-cycle engine achieves its efficiency with unique valve timing that effectively lengthens the expansion stroke. The basic design has actually been around for many years, but only in very low-speed industrial applications. Adapting its unique combination of power and efficiency for high-rpm automotive applications had long intrigued automotive engineers. And frustrated them—until Mazda tackled the design. Mazda engineers harnessed its potential by utilizing (among other measures) forced induction in the form of a highly efficient Lysholm compressor and twin air-to-air intercoolers.

That's all well and good, you say, but how does it drive? Glad you asked. Step on the gas, and you get instant response, without the lag typical of some turbocharged cars, and a smooth and seamless flow of power. The accompanying sounds are also very satisfying. We confess to frequently taking full advantage of this power, whether passing a truck or just for the heck of it. And the overall fuel economy is actually superior to the standard Millenia's responsive V6, even with 23% more power.

Not that the Millenia story is just about a great engine. While devouring straightaways, this car handles curves with the same ease, exhibiting minimal body lean and a very positive steering feel. We found it quite easy to maintain an entertaining clip on the forest roads. As for the technical details, it's front-wheel drive, with rack-and-pinion steering and an advanced 4-wheel independent multilink suspension. In the rear, the design subtly "steers" the wheels for better handling performance and feel. Both the front and rear suspensions have been retuned for 2001, in favor of sportier, crisper response. Fine by us.

Just putting the key into the ignition was a singular experience in the Millenia—with a quiet whir, the steering wheel moved down.

And things only got better. We noticed that instead of the usual array of gauges, there was only a glossy blank panel. Then we turned the key, and a full complement of instruments sprang to illuminated life. Mazda calls it an Optitron™ display.



We easily found a comfortable driving position, using the 8-way adjustable power seats. Our backs especially appreciated the driver's power lumbar support, with a switch located on the console so we didn't have to twist to get at it. Our initial impression of the seats, subsequently confirmed on the trip, was that they delivered an ideal combination of firmness, comfort and support. The leather-trimmed upholstery* had a rich and luxurious feel, as well.

Convenient control placement further enhanced our experience. Once you get used to having the key stereo controls on the

steering wheel, for instance, you'll start thinking of that as a necessity rather than a luxury. We could say the same thing for the power moonroof, and the very effective and easily adjusted automatic climate control system. Mazda told us that it includes air filtration to remove most dust and pollen.

Overall operation of the controls was so precise, it was easy for us to imagine we were piloting a plane. And that feeling charges the whole driving experience.

The Millenia S never failed to surprise us with the scope of its luxury features. Every day, every drive, we seemed to find something new. And we're still not even sure that we discovered everything.

noted a sense of spaciousness—and, to their satisfaction, a pair of cup holders in the fold-down rear center armrest. (When the armrest is folded down, there's a pass-through to the trunk to let you carry skis.) The front console also has two cup holders, and an extra 12-volt outlet as well. So we could recharge our cell phone and our laptop at

the same time. Good thing, too, given our deadlines, or you might not be reading this now.

When you test a car this good, the trip always seems too short. Fortunately (we think), this one turned out to be just long enough. Exploring historic Pioneer Square our last afternoon, we made one more discovery—a piece of sculptural art we immediately knew we couldn't live without: "Octopus House Post," by Scott Jensen, at the Stonington Gallery. "Ship it," we said.

We immediately found the remote keyless entry that works in conjunction with the power door locks and trunk, and provides selective unlocking. We could unlock just the driver's door, or all the doors—a good security feature. Power windows are standard too, and a thoughtful retained-power feature lets you operate the windows or sunroof for one minute after you turn off the ignition.

While Mazda's engineers were dedicated to making the Millenia fun to drive, they also are totally committed to occupant safety. To ensure that, the entire design was carefully thought out on the virtual reality of the computer, long before any Millenia put wheel to pavement.


You can see some of this in the illustration below. And the safety benefits of the Millenia's structure go well beyond

impact protection. The stable platform helps the suspension do its job, which in turn helps the driver avoid potential problems. As do anti-lock brakes (ABS), the available Traction Control System, and halogen fog lights that help improve visibility in foul weather.

Inside the Millenia, dual 2nd-generation air bags help protect the front passengers, as do side-impact air bags mounted in the front seats.* The four outboard occupants also get 3-point safety belts; there's a lap belt for the rear center passenger. In the rear, international-standard tether anchors make it easy to properly install child safety seats designed to those standards.

Millenia comes in two flavors, the standard Millenia and the Millenia S described in the road test. Both are very well-equipped; the essential difference is that the Millenia S, with its 210-hp Miller-cycle engine and 17-inch wheels, is more performance-oriented. The standard Millenia has a 170-hp V6 and 16-inch wheels. Almost all of the luxury features, such as the 8-way power driver's and front passenger's seats, leather-trimmed upholstery,* power moonroof, tilt steering wheel with memory function, and automatic climate control, are standard on both models. The Bose® audio system, standard on the S, is available for the Millenia. For those who live in more severe climates, a 4-Seasons Package option adds the Traction Control System (already standard on the S), heated mirrors and front seats, and other features that are valuable in cold weather.
